Pet Responsibilities

There are two issues that the board has gotten a great number of complaints about lately, both have to do with animals. Several individuals have had their screens ripped and in some cases, outdoor furniture damaged by roaming cats. Please be advised that it is a violation of our covenants to let cats (or any animals) roam freely. As it is impossible for the compliance committee to keep up with the number of complaints on this issue, individuals who complain of cat problems are being advised to call animal control to have the offending animals removed. If you have a pet cat please keep it indoors so that it doesn't get picked up.

The other major complaint has been about folks not picking up after their dogs. There is no region in the neighborhood where it is okay to leave dog droppings, vacant lots and HOA property included. By Charleston city code is not even okay to leave dog droppings in your own yard (see below). So help keep our neighborhood beautiful and odor free by bringing your plastic bag when you take fido for a walk. Your neighbors will thank you!

City of Charleston Environmental Control Ordinance, Article 2 sec 26-2:

"It shall be unlawful for any owner, keeper or walker of any dog or cat to permit his or her dog or cat to discharge its excreta upon the property of the owner of the animal or upon the property of one who has assented thereto unless such owner, keeper or walker immediately thereafter removes said animal's excreta from the public or private property in question."
